If your child is involved with any of these, please encourage them to know when rehearsals etc are and attend are every session so they feel fully prepared.

Anyone who learns an instrument with us will continue to have lessons until the last week of school. If your child will still be with us next year, they should take their instrument home over the summer holidays before lessons resume again in September. If your child will be leaving us at the end of this academic year, please ensure any school instruments/music are returned in their final lesson.

We often receive requests for children to begin learning an extra instrument in school but unfortunately this is not possible as there are children on our waiting list and new children will be joining us in September. As a general rule, we also do not allow children to switch to new instruments, unless already discussed with Miss Campbell and/or the music tutor. We provide many opportunities for them to move beyond beginner level, when they may be invited to join an ensemble and/or sit an exam, both ways for them to improve their musical skillset.
