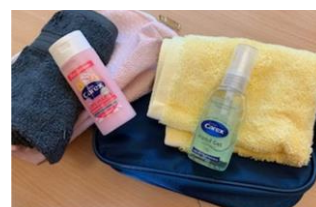
COVID-19 UPDATE

I attended a Public Health England webinar this week, which was a very useful update, specifically for Southwark schools. It's good to know that Southwark is currently rag-rated green, and as such, is not a borough of intervention or concern. You might be interested to know that Southwark is one of only four London boroughs where there is a Local Contact Tracing system in place, which takes over from the NHS Track and Trace when people cannot be located. This involves knocking on doors and providing Public Health information.

There was much discussion around the difficulty of ensuring social distancing amongst parents and carers at drop-off and pick-up times. There is no easy answer. It was highlighted that the possibility of transmission is much reduced outside, but where you can't maintain a 2m distance, you may wish to wear a face covering at this time.

Our cleaning regime is incredibly robust and the Premises Team have worked hard to establish systems and routines. I was shocked, however, to learn that we have used a normal terms worth of paper towels in one week alone. I was more shocked at the estimated cost for the year if we maintain this level of usage - approximately £8k!!!

So, putting our creative hats on, we've got an idea that we would like to trial. We have spoken to the children in assembly today, and from Monday, we would like to invite them to bring in a **small wash bag** containing a **hand flannel** (and a **small bottle of hand sanitiser** if they wish) to keep in the classroom, for their personal use only. The children can keep these at their desks, use throughout the day at key points as identified by the teacher and then bring them home to be washed at the end of the week. As always, please name all items that are brought in to school. Let's see how it goes...

A FEW START OF TERM REMINDERS!

Lost property: It may not surprise you to know that already we have several items of lost property! Fortunately, all correctly named pieces are working their way back to the rightful owner. The children are reminded by their class teachers, teaching assistants and the midday supervisors to collect their belongings. Time is given at the end of lunch and the end of the day to collect sweatshirts, hoodies and packed lunch boxes. We are doing all we can to encourage your children to be responsible. Access to the school site: A polite reminder that at this time, unless you have a pre-arranged appointment, there is no access on to the school site for parents and carers. This includes the use of our toilet facilities.

OUR LOCAL ROAD SAFETY

We are aware of the current traffic situation in the Village at school drop off and collection times. We also know there are many differing opinions and feelings about solutions. As a school we are totally committed to ensuring all our children arrive safely, on time, and will always encourage active travel to and from school by bike, scooter or walking, recognising that this is not possible for all. It's not a pedestrianised area.
