I have the absolute pleasure of sharing with you that, following our Ofsted inspection just before the Easter break in March, Dulwich Hamlet Junior School has been recognised as **OUTSTANDING** in all inspection areas. We received the final report yesterday, which we are now able to share with our community. We have attached the report to your HH email today for you to read. The report will also be available to view via the Ofsted website towards the end of next week.

An inspection is a two-day snap-shot of a school, and the report is a short summary of an extensive range of activities carried out by the inspection team. I was so pleased that our team quickly 'got under the skin' of the Hamlet, and this shines through in our report.

In our final feedback, the Lead Inspector wanted to make clear that this is not re-validation of our 'Outstanding' from the previous inspection back in 2008. He detailed that this is a completely new judgement, rooted in a new framework with a very different set of expections. To achieve 'Outstanding', is an exacting judgement. We certainly felt this as we moved through the two days – no stone was left unturned!

As such, you will notice that there are no areas for improvement listed. This does not mean that there is nothing to work on, quite the contrary! DHJS does not stop moving, tweaking, and refining our work. We continue to be an outward facing school that continually seeks best practice from which we can learn. In turn, we continue to share and disseminate our practice widely.

Our Hamleteers and DHJS staff team absolutely 'shone' during our two-day inspection. It was a joy observing our day-to-day work through the eyes of our visitors and I was reminded of why we do what we do.

Thank you, once again, for completing the parent/carer questionnaire, and for your kindness and support during these intense couple of days.

I couldn't be prouder of our community.





CURRICULUM SPECIAL: Religious Education (RE)


