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HEAD OF SCHOOL'S NOTE

I am sure the children are looking forward to a well-deserved rest as we approach this February half-term break.

With the weather still on the colder side, it is possible that our Hamleteers may be spending greater time inside rather than out, and maybe enjoying some down-time on their mobile devices, if they have them. Some questions for you all to consider: Do you monitor your child's online activity? Will you be confident knowing what information, games, platforms your children are likely to/going to be accessing? What family rules do you have around screen time usage? Have you had conversations with your children about acceptable behaviour as a good digital citizen? We have recently been dealing with a serious online bullying incident that, as tends to happen, has found its way into school. While these behaviours do take place away from school, we see it as part of our duty and responsibility to act upon, and take them seriously. We appreciate that when used responsibly, technology can be fun, educational, and a positive means of communication. However, when 'chat' turns nasty, the taunts can feel far more humiliating and upsetting than any comments made in the playground. The comments do not go away.

Please read on to learn about some of the work we have been doing recently with our children for Safer Internet Day. The children have certainly taken this work seriously.

I do hope you have pencilled-in Thursday 28th February, 6:45-8pm for our **Online Safety Curriculum Workshop**, led jointly by Victoria Begley (Online Safety Coordinator) and Lorraine Thomas (Learning Coach, The Parent Coaching Academy). While so much of this really is a common sense approach, I think it is always good to be reminded of how you can ensure safe internet/use of mobile technology at home with some practical advice and examples of the work we do in school, including that regarding online bullying and mindful use of social media.

SAFER INTERNET DAY



Last week's celebration of Safer Internet Day was a great success. Our introductory assembly looked at when (and how) we give permission online, reminding children that it is okay to say 'NO' if someone asks to use or share something. In class, Y3 and Y4 focused on being internet sharp - exploring how much we can accidentally reveal about ourselves when we share online, and when it is okay to share about other people. Y5 and Y6 focused on consent, considering the laws that govern how our personal data can be used, as well as the potential consequences of inappropriate sharing. HALF-TERMLY UPDATE FROM THE CHAIR OF GOVERNORS

The school governor role is a strategic one which:

- * Ensures clarity of vision, ethos and direction
- * Holds school leaders to account for educational performance
- * Oversees financial performance and makes sure money is well spent

The role is sometimes described as a 'critical friend'.

Governors are volunteers who apply a wide range of skills, experiences and backgrounds to support and oversee the school.

To carry out our role we attend training to keep up to date with new developments and requirements. For example, governors recently joined the Head of School and her team to learn about the new tools introduced by the DfE to measure school performance. Tonight we will be attending training on 'Prevent' – part of the government's strategy to prevent extremism. Governors also attend events such as parent cafes and curriculum evenings where possible, which provides a good opportunity to chat to parents and carers for those of us who aren't parents or carers of children currently at the school.
