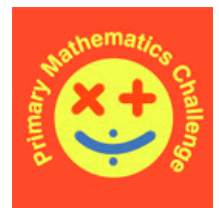

DHJS IN BLOOM!

As we say goodbye to the winter months, our front flower beds are beginning to show their colour, with daffodils, tulips and hyacinths winning the show. Each year group planted the bulbs before the winter break, and have been watering and weeding diligently when required. Nature and Gardening sessions are taking place, and this month, we will be receiving a small child-friendly greenhouse that will be used by the children to grow seedlings before planting them in the beds and in the front garden.



Safe hideaways can be hard for wildlife to find in some gardens, especially near busy roads. Over the next few weeks, children will be creating a multi-storey hotel full of natural materials to provide shelter for insects, and to encourage more wildlife into the garden. Thank you Alleyn Park Garden Centre, who have kindly donated old pallets for this use.

If you have any old **wooden pallets, hollow bamboo canes or logs, broken terracotta pots** or **old pieces of rugs** that you could donate to school to help build the bug hotels, please email Miss Harris (bharris22.210@lgflmail.org) who will communicate what we already have and when they could be brought in.

We are also hoping to thicken the beds of the front garden with more young trees and wildflowers in summer to further attract bees and other insects. If you have any spare packets of seeds or bulbs that you are not going to use, we would appreciate any donations. Children can hand these straight to Miss Harris.

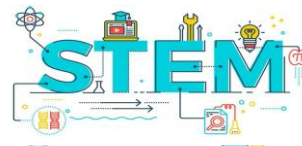
DULWICH VILLAGE EASTER EGG HUNT
