SCHOOL UNIFORM: POLITE REMINDER

Compared to many schools our uniform code is not strict. We do ask though that our children wear the DHJS school uniform with appropriate footwear for school, and on PE days they come dressed in kit. We understand that as we are nearing the end of the summer term, especially for Y6 who are moving on, that you may not yet want to replace out-grown uniform. However, we are seeing some combinations of clothing/foot wear that are not acceptable for school. We will speak to you/your child if we see that this is the case.

It is really important the children wear trainers for PE and navy PE shorts, not the tailored type often worn for uniform; this is for their safety and also for flexibility and movement.

For swimming, JAGS pool rule is for any school children to wear a swimming hat. We are guests in their pool so we agree to abide by their rules. Every child must have a swimming hat for their lessons and for the swim gala (Y4/5, Friday 7th July).
