We will hold our formal parents evenings towards the beginning of next term, when you will get the opportunity to meet 1:1 with your child's class teacher. This will be followed with a further Open Classroom in the summer term.

MUSIC: ASSISTED PURCHASE SCHEME Y6

The window for Y6 parents of children who learn an instrument with us at school to take advantage of the Assisted Purchase Scheme is now open. This is an initiative that enables parents to purchase a musical instrument via the school without paying VAT, therefore saving 20%. There is a set of criteria and guidelines to follow; please see the leaflet on our website for the full information. There will be hardcopies available in the office. This is a great opportunity to be secondary 'musically' ready as the majority of secondary schools do not provide instruments for their musicians. The deadline for selecting an instrument will be Thursday 28th February 2019.
