


SAFER ROUTES TO SCHOOL





EASY FAJITAS

INGREDIENTS

FAJITAS

- · 1 medium onion
- · 1 red pepper
- 1 green pepper
- 2 chicken breast
- 1 tsp smoked paprika
- · 1/2 tsp ground cumin
- · 4 flour tortillas
- 150ml yoghurt
- 50g grated cheese
- 1 avocado

SALSA

1/2 red onion 2 tomatoes 1/4 coriander

METHOD

- · Slice onions and peppers
- · Slice chicken into strips and marinade in paprika, onion and 1/2 lime
- · Leave to marinade for 30 minutes
- Make the salsa dice red onion, tomatoes and chipped coriander, then add 1/2 lime juice
- · Place pan on high heat
- · Add a drizzle of oil then fry the onions, peppers and chicken
- · Stir every 30 seconds
- · Cook for 8 minutes until chicken is golden brown and cooked through
- · Warm tortillas in microwave or a dry frying pan
- Serve family style with bowls of yoghurt, sliced avocado, lime wedges and salsa
