If you have recently received an offer for your younger child to join us in Y3 this coming September, please tick our 'Document Check' off your to-do list! You will find a set of dates/times (starting next week) within your offer letter, when we are able to receive this information from you. The final date we have set aside for receiving this documentation in order to secure your place is **Friday 5**th **May.**

We will then be moving forward with the next stage of the transition process for our new entrants, including gathering information from feeder schools and yourselves. This will support us in forming the new class lists. We will only be contacting families/discussing children with feeder schools who have confirmed places. We have a tight time-frame to work towards, so please prioritise this document check next week (you must still do this even if you already have a sibling at DHJS).

PLEASE BE CAREFUL!!!!!

It has come to our attention that Hamlet families are parking and driving dangerously, close to the bottom of Court Lane and Calton Avenue.

We have been made aware that a few parents/carers who drive, use the area near to the planters as a drop-off/pick-up 'zone', parking illegally and dangerously reversing across the pavement where lots of people are walking, or across the path of oncoming cyclists.

Such behaviours could easily result in a collision, with people walking or cycling.

We know that Southwark's enforcement officers are in attendance, but we would also like to remind our community of drivers to park sensibly, even if that means finding a safe place to park slightly further away, then walking the short distance to school.

We appreciate that time is of the essence for us all in the mornings, but if that means leaving slightly earlier in the morning, in order to avoid rushing and a potential accident, then we think you would have to agree that it has to be worth it.

CURRICULUM SPECIAL: COMPUTING

Children at Dulwich Hamlet are continuing to develop their computing knowledge and skills through a diverse range of topics across all year groups. Programming dancing cats in Year 3; learning how to add code to keep a score in a game where a monkey catches bananas in Year 4; developing a catching game in Year 5 and making a digital version of rock, paper, scissors in Year 6 are all topics that we have developed to teach computer science concepts and key programming features last term or this.



Although we sometimes use other software, such as Scratch Jr to program the dancing cats, our central resource remains Purple Mash where we use both the block-based 2Code and text-based Logo apps. We also use many of the other Purple Mash apps in our lessons with a digital literacy focus, such as animation. With so much to teach and with time always at a premium, we benefit from the apps in Purple Mash sharing common user interface features – consistent painting tools in different apps and similarly organised menus, for example, a consistent way of issuing work tasks, via 2Dos, and saving that work in shared class folders. These common features reduce time spent explaining, for example, how to open a particular program or save work in five different pieces of software.



Another strength of using Purple Mash is that it can be used on PCs, Macs, Chromebooks or many tablets. Being web-based, if you have a computer or tablet at home then you will usually be able to look at the work your daughter or son has been doing recently. You need to be able to get to the website - https://www.purplemash.com/ - and click on the 'Child' button. Your child will need to know his or her username and password. Most children do, but ask us if you need help with this.



We are continuing to develop and extend the range of topics that we teach to add breadth to our curriculum offer. A recent introduction for classes in years 4, 5 and 6 was the animation program 2Animate. Although we used only quite a short unit, usually animating a bouncing ball, children took to it with great enthusiasm, really enjoying the way that they could control their short films.

- What is at stake whether we choose to be proactive or reactive in our dialogue about sex and sexuality with our children and teens.
