


CURRICULUM SPECIAL: SCIENCE

Our vision at Dulwich Hamlet Junior School is to ensure we provide a 'glittering' curriculum. Over their time at our school, the children will attend many different trips, visits and workshops. However, these are chosen with care and consideration to ensure that the experiences are well-connected to their in-class learning, highlighting key learning points, building connections to the wider world and involving children in applying their knowledge contextually.



For example, this half term, Y5 have had a visit from the Wonderdome, a mobile planetarium that puts on an interactive planetarium show, taking the children on a journey through space. It looks closely at the moon and the sun, embedding and extending key learning about the lunar cycle and our nearest star.

PRINCIPLES OF OUTSTANDING SCIENCE LEARNING

Science at DHJS fosters and develops our pupils' curiosity about natural phenomena and enables our children to make sense of the ever-changing world in which they live

- Children build connections to prior science knowledge
- Children plan well-resourced, exciting, practical investigations
- Children explore their ideas by asking questions and discussing answers
- Children engage in their learning through purposeful, rich and hands-on tasks
- · Children discover links with the wider world through enriching activities



A principle for outstanding science learning at DHJS is that 'Children discover links with the wider world through enriching activities'. Across all year groups children participate in Science beyond their classroom to embed, challenge and broaden their ideas about the unit of work they are learning about.



In Year 6, the children visit the Centre of the Cell, a science education centre within biomedical laboratories. The children engage in a workshop on the circulatory system and, on returning to the classroom, the children produce their own detailed diagrams and explanations to practise their new understanding of our heart.



Above all, these experiences help children embrace our school value 'enjoyment'. Children have fun, participating in memorable and exciting experiences linked to their subjects, highlighting to them the importance in engaging in their learning to make the most of it.

Engaging our wider school and parent community with our children's science learning helps children to recognise how the subject is applicable to life outside of school and possible future careers. We invite parents/carers in to share talks on their careers and how it links to science, ranging from beekeeping, engineering, video production and more. We are always looking for volunteers to help enrich our curriculum; most jobs involve STEM subjects, so please don't hesitate to get in contact with the school if you are able to offer your time to continue enhancing our science provision for our children.

Our Governors have recently reviewed our RSE (Relationships and Sex Education) Policy. We consulted with all stakeholders back in 2020 when this policy was first written, in response to the DfE's statutory guidance for *Relationships Education*, *Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) and Health Education*.

Very little has changed to the policy, apart from the ordering of some topics. Y4, 5 and 6 parents will know from their RSE letter at the beginning of this term, that we moved the 'Changing Me' unit of work to spring 1, instead of it being taught in summer 2, along with the rationale for doing so.




Collection Date
