HEADTEACHER'S NOTE

Thank you again for taking time out to come and support your children at our St. Barnabas Christmas Celebration this week. Our Hamleteers took us on a beautiful, historical journey of the Christmas carol and song, The spoken word, dance and singing was just terrific.

Further to my 'Attendance and Puntucality Special' last week, we have picked-up on a few useful points you have raised/requested clarity over:

If an absence is unavoidable, you should put in a request for an absence for a full session (morning/ afternoon/or full day). Our Hamlet procedure is that you complete an Absence Request Form in advance. We have now placed an editable word version on the website ('parents' drop down menu, 'attendance & punctuality' tab, see link bottom of 'attendance' page. You can also always request a hard copy from the office. If your child has an unavoidable medical appointment during the core school day, which is shorter than a session i.e. coming in at 10am after an appointment, leaving at 2:30pm to get to an appointment, then we ask that you email the office in the normal way to notify them of this. Please always provide evidence of the appointment (for example, text screen shot of message, copy of letter) as we need to have seen evidence of where the children are during the core school day. Please read on for some further punctuality information.

Don't forget that we go right through to Thursday 21st December, finishing promptly at 1:25pm for pick-up. A normal school lunch is provided on this day.

PUNCTUALITY UPDATE



All times are taken from the digital clock in the school office

We had **98** late marks recorded in the register this week alone. Was one of these marks for your child? (In some instances, there are several 'lates' recorded per child)

We have to do better...

We can't state it more strongly. Punctuality is critical to an excellent start to the school day, ensuring readiness for learning. We know that our families take their child's schooling seriously, and urge you to review your morning routines so that our Hamleteers arrive between 8:45-8:55am. Nearer to 8:45am is much better, as the children get the full benefit of our daily early morning work provision. This adds-up, and makes a difference to your child.

As a reminder, this is the staged process in terms of recording punctuality every day:

8.45am:

Gates open and pupils can go into their classrooms

8.55am:

School gates are "closed", registers are taken – all pupils who are late, must now go to the front office.

8.56am-9:15am:

Children are registered as 'late'. Parents/Carers will have to provide the exact reason as to why they are late. This will be recorded on the register as code L. Code L does not contribute to the issue of penalty notices.

9:16am onwards:

Children are registered as 'very late'. Parents/Carers will have to provide the exact reason as to why they are very late. This will be recorded on the register as code U. Code U **does** contribute to penalty notices as it is an unauthorised absence. It is very important to avoid code U by being on time for school every day.

We are writing to families next week where lateness has become an issue and needs to improve.

CHRISTMAS LUNCH

If your child normally brings a packed lunch to school, and would like to take a school lunch as a one-off on Friday 15th December to share a Christmas meal with their friends, this is a final reminder to inform the office asap via email. Chef BJ needs to know final numbers, so we ask that you let us know if your child wants to do this by the close of play on Monday 11th December.

You can view the festive menu further on in the HH. It looks yummy!

YEAR GROUP CHRISTMAS PARTIES

Each year group will be having a festive party in the last week of term. Years 3 and 6 will be on Tuesday 19th December and Years 4 and 5 on Wednesday 20th December. The party will be during the afternoon with dancing and party games. There will also be a designated quiet area for each year group. The PTA are kindly providing some party food: a chocolate bar, a packet of crisps and a juice drink. (We will be mindful of known allergies)
