AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS INFORMATION

We are so fortunate to be able to offer numerous after school clubs ranging from art and craft to sport, and we are delighted that so many of our Hamleteers are keen to take up the offer and get involved.

All clubs start next week. Clubs start at 3.30pm and run for an hour. At 4.30pm, all the children are dismissed from the front gate in Village playground.

3.30pm snacks... We would prefer your child not to have a snack between finishing class and starting club. However, we do recognise that some children may need a small something just to see them through the rest of the afternoon. Any snacks should be healthy ones and please be mindful that we have a number of different food allergies in school.

Sport clubs: if your child has PE on the same day as an afterschool club, they are ready and dressed appropriately. If your child doesn't have PE on a day they are attending a sport club, they will need to bring in their school PE kit and change at the end of the day. It's good practice to change clothing for sport; as a minimum they must have a pair of trainers in order to be able to participate.

The children will be reminded about clubs and the logistics involved in assemblies, as well as from their class teachers. All class teachers have club lists, and we have a dedicated 'club runner' to assist during the hour and dismissing at 4.30pm.

We are mindful that parents are waiting to pay for clubs and indeed, other items too. Please do not panic, you will not lose any places already offered for clubs. The facility to make payments (via our ParentPay system) will be up and running for you early next week.

SCHOOL UNIFORM (and associated bits!)

Our school uniform is simple and when everyone wears the combo of blue and jade, the pupils look fantastic and proud to be part of Dulwich Hamlet Junior School. We ask that the children wear a jade polo shirt or navy t-shirt (these can be the school branded ones or plain), navy trousers, shorts or a skirt. We also have the option of a navy cardigan, a navy sweatshirt and the navy hoodies (these can also be the school brand ones with the logo or plain).

Socks should be plain blue, black or grey, and we ask that all children wear socks every day. Shoes should cover the whole foot, be dark in colour and be practical for moving around the school and running at break and lunchtimes. We also allow plain black trainers for everyday wear.

All of our uniform is available online, or we have a well-stocked second-hand uniform shop run by the PTA on certain Friday mornings. See Key Dates section of the HH.

Our PE kit is a white t-shirt with the school logo or plain white, navy shorts and trainers. Tracksuit bottoms are allowed for outside PE in the winter months although the children do need shorts for dance and gymnastics. If your child chooses to wear black trainers as their 'school shoe' they will need a separate pair of trainers for PE and the daily mile.

The children also need to bring in a **named** water bottle. We no longer have drinking fountains. We have filling stations and the children are able to refill their bottles at points during the school day.

Our aim is to get the children in the playground at break and lunchtime. We will send them out in light rain, colder weather etc. We only keep them in if it's torrential rain, a storm or dangerous to be outside. It is therefore vital your child has an appropriate jacket or coat in school every day.

We cannot stress enough how important it is to have every item clearly named. We have a reminder bell for the children to collect their belongings and staff are constantly reminding children to pick up coats, hoodies etc.

Our lost property is quite astonishing! If an item is named it will eventually be returned to its owner. Any unnamed items will be given to the PTA for the second-hand shop. Coats will be given to a charity and lunch boxes will have to be thrown away. Our playground becomes a play area for wildlife when we've all gone home. Your children must take responsibility for their possessions and collect their items when reminded.

We'd also like to take this opportunity to remind you about jewellery and hair. The only jewellery permitted is stud earrings and a watch (no Apple or equivalent watches please). We would prefer the children not to wear either on PE days, including swimming and dance, but we can keep them somewhere safe if necessary. Hair that is shoulder length or longer should be tied back away from the face; equally hair that covers the face needs to be tied back or in a hairband to keep it out of eyes during lesson time. This is also particularly important during PE.

MUSIC DEPARTMENT NEWS



Welcome back to another musical year! The DHJS Music Department has hit the ground running, preparing for the year ahead. Instrumental Lessons: If your child learned an instrument with us last year, they will have (had) a lesson with their tutor this week or next, but will not have regular timetabled lessons for the next couple of weeks. You will be told when they need to have their instruments and music in.

If your child is new to the school or is on the waiting list from last year, we are making arrangements to match interested children with instruments. This will definitely take a few weeks as there are many children and factors to consider. We will also be introducing the Y3 children to the variety of instruments we teach here so the children may develop an interested in in different ones to those you put on your form. Miss Campbell will speak with the children to discuss any updates they may have.

Please note that there is a cost associated with these lessons and there is always more interest than availability, especially in certain instruments. Due to time/space restrictions, not all children will be offered an instrumental place right away. This is often disappointing for families, so please speak with your children about this being a possibility and be reassured that they will definitely get an offer as soon as we have the availability.

Choir started back this week with a very proud Miss Campbell and 120(!) enthusiastic voices. Choir takes place on Wednesday mornings from 8-8:45am in Turney Hall. It is open to every child, and does not need auditions, signing up or payment. We request that children arrive promptly at 8am through Village Gate so we can make the most of the sessions without disruptions. Children can dip in and out of attending choir but they must come regularly if they would like to be invited to perform in concerts. Any Y4-6 children who are interested in attending Young Voices this year will be receiving information next week about how to request tickets/merchandise as the deadlines for this have all been brought forward.

Ensembles will be starting up next week for most groups. If your child was in an ensemble last year, they will be welcomed back this year and we will also be inviting some new children to join. We celebrate experienced members supporting newer members as we begin to work towards the Christmas Concert (date tbc). Please note that ensembles are invite-only so watch out for paper copies of letters to return via bookbags. If your child is in Y4 or above and learns an instrument in or outside of school (having reached approximately grade 1 standard) and they would be interested in being involved in an ensemble, please let their tutor or Miss Campbell know.

Steel pans will start back for anyone who was in the summer term groups last year. Once again, this is always a popular activity so please return your slips as soon as possible, even if your child no longer wishes to continue. This makes organising the groups much easier and we will be able to see if we have availability for any new children to join the groups. If you are interested in your child being added to the waiting list, please watch out for online communications as well as paper copies in bookbags. Please note: steel pans are a Y4/5/6 activity and we also are going to continue our fabulous parent and carer group. There are still places available in this group, please email the office for a copy of the letter providing details. The adult group and Y 5&6s will work towards a performance at the PTA Christmas Fair on Saturday 25th November.

Performance opportunities: The children are fortunate in that they have the opportunity to see our talented music staff perform in assemblies over the first few weeks. It is such a treat to be able to appreciate live music performances and it is inspiring for the children to see their tutors in their professional capacity. We will be sharing our ensemble music through concerts again this year and our Hamleteers will be offered informal opportunities to perform in front of the school as the year goes through. If you play a musical instrument and feel you would be interested in sharing that music with the children, we would love you to get in touch.

We look forward to another year of music making!
